## Guest Speakers

**JOHN GALLAGHER** - Although the head coach of the University of Hartford men's basketball team for the past two years, John Gallagher is no stranger to the Philadelphia area. He has held numerous coaching positions at the University of Pennsylvania, La Salle University, Saint Joseph's University and Lafayette College. At Hartford, Gallagher has gone 20-42 overall and 14-18 in the America East conference.

**JOHN GIANNINI** — Dr. John Giannini finished his eighth season as head coach at La Salle University in 2011-12, leading the Explorers to a 21-13 overall record and a 9-7 mark in the Atlantic 10. The team finished the season in the NIT First Round, the first postseason appearance for the program in 20 years. The 21 wins were also the most since 1990. Giannini is La Salle's all-time winningest coach in Atlantic 10 play and has produced the program's only winning A-10 records since joining the league in 1995-96. He is also the winningest coach in Maine history and when he left Rowan University, Giannini was the winningest active NCAA Division III head coach. Giannini authored *Court Sense: Winning Basketball's Mental Game*, published by Human Kinetics in 2008. He has also authored articles for academic research journals and practical coaching publications.

**PAUL HEWITT** - Coach Hewitt completed his first year as the head coach of the George Mason University men's basketball team in 2011-12 after serving 11 seasons at the helm of the Georgia Tech program. At GMU, Hewitt went 24-9 overall and 14-4 in the Colonial Athletic Conference. In 11 seasons under Hewitt, Tech went to the NCAA Tournament five times, played for a national championship, played for two ACC championships, advanced to the Postseason NIT quarterfinals and won the Preseason NIT. He restored a national profile to Tech basketball with traditional values, instilling in his program the importance of strong defense, teamwork and sharing the basketball, individual skill development and mental preparation. His career record stands at 280-198.

**TINA MARTIN** - The winningest basketball coach in University of Delaware history, Tina Martin's Blue Hens went on a magnificent journey during the 2011-12 season that ended in the second round of the 2012 NCAA Women's Basketball Championship. Along the way, Martin and All-American Elena Delle Donne led Delaware to a 31-2 record, a No. 14 final national ranking, a 21-game school-record win streak and a Colonial Athletic Association conference championship. Martin will begin her 17th season at Delaware with a career record of 309-177, 10 20-win seasons and nine post-season appearances. Earlier this year, Martin was a special guest at Vice President Joe Biden and Dr. Jill Biden's Women's History Month reception at the Naval Observatory.
